Seed name: Asian Greens, Mizuna

Number of seeds: 20



Care Guide: With its narrow white stems and bright-green, lacy edged leaves, this elegant Japanese green has a delicious spicy flavor and a texture similar to arugula, but with a milder taste. As a salad green, this variety is best eaten young; it is also excellent in stir-fries and soups as plants mature. It can be used as a cut-and-come again crop; harvest leaves as needed (or simply pick the whole head).

Seed name: Aster, Smooth Blue

Care guide: The leaves on Smooth Blue Aster are indeed smooth to the touch. The similar-looking Sky Blue Aster (*Symphotrichum oolentangiense*) has rough leaves, as do many other Asters. The tough stem often takes on a shade of blue also and will allow Smooth Blue Aster to stand tall during its long late summer to mid fall bloom. A non-aggressive rhizomatous root system allows the plant to spread slowly. In a garden setting, Smooth Blue Aster will persist for many years.

The beautiful late blooming flowers attract many different pollinators. Smooth Blue Aster is also a host plant for the Silvery Checkerspot and the Pearl Crescent butterflies.

Genovese Basil today is considered by all to be the superior basil for making the tastiest pesto in the world. Plant these Genovese Basil seeds in a sunny spot and enjoy a tasty harvest of one of the world's favorite herbs.

These bush beans are high yielders and resistant to common bean mosaic, pod mottle and curly top virus.

Sow seeds outdoors after danger of frost has passed and soil and air temperatures have warmed. Harvest frequently to increase yield.

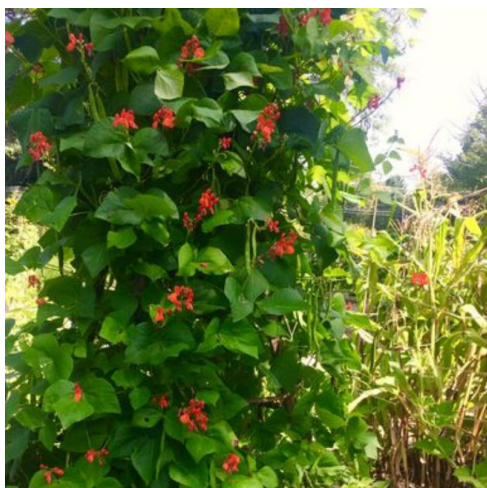


Care Guide: Grow a lot of beans in a smaller space. Blue Lake Pole Bean sets pods from the base to the top of the vine—so you'll have plenty for eating fresh and processing. Produces heavy yields of straight, smooth 6 in. pods that are crisp and stringless at all stages, never limp. They cook up tender, with full-bodied Blue Lake flavor. Like other pole beans, they require some type of support or trellis. For a tender texture, harvest beans when they are young and succulent. For top yields, keep picking throughout the season or the plant will stop producing.

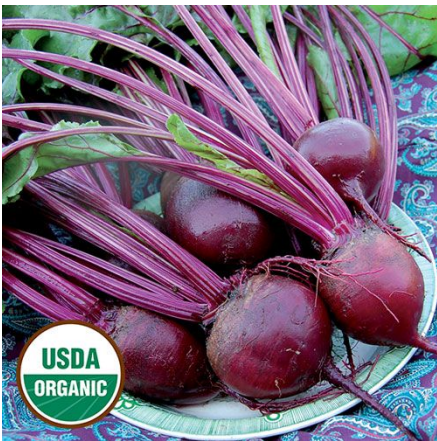

Seed name: Beet, Early Wonder

Number of seeds: 5



Care Guide: Early Wonder has delivered abundant greens, flavorful beets, and early production. Great for mild climates where multiple crops are possible. The 18" greens are as delicious, and high in vitamins A and C, iron, and potassium. Beet seed is actually a dried fruit with 1-5 seeds in each fruit, so thinning is very important.

Seed name: Black-Eyed Susan, (Sow Easy)

Care Guide: Versatile, drought-tolerant and easy-to-grow. A native plant that attracts a variety of pollinators, it pairs beautifully with other prairie favorites like Purple Coneflower and Butterfly Weed. Its adaptable nature makes it a great choice for poor soils and tough conditions.

(Sow Easy seeds are pelleted with an all-natural coating made from a mix of clay, perlite, and FDA-approved food coloring. This coating adds some bulk to small seeds and stands out in the soil, making direct sowing and accurate spacing easier.)

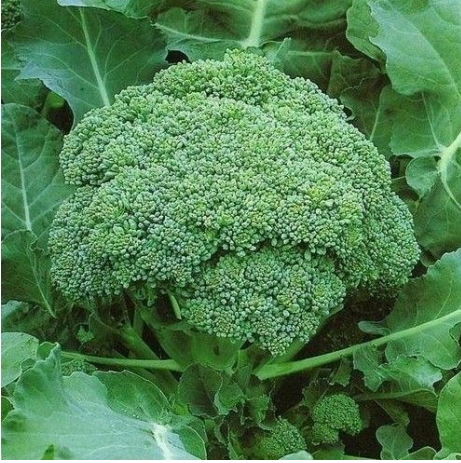

Plant Long Island Improved Brussels Sprouts seeds in spring, summer, or fall - this is a very durable variety that can withstand cooler temperatures. The compact plant can grow up to 24 inches and will yield up to 100 sprouts over an extended period of time.

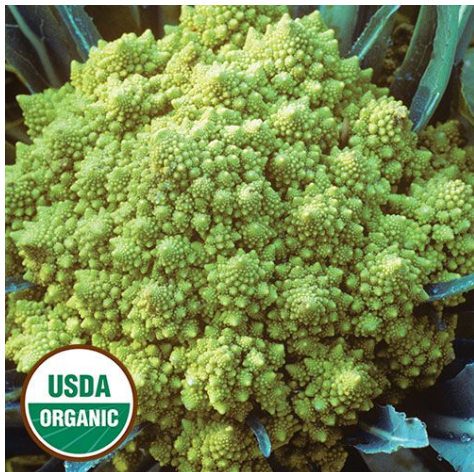

Seed name: Celery, Tall Utah

Number of seeds: 10



Care Guide: Celery needs light to germinate so sow seeds very shallowly. In cool climates, sow indoors, then moisten and cover with clear plastic. When celery leaves begin to emerge, remove the plastic cover and place the container in a sunny spot, always keeping soil moist. When there are two true leaves, transplant outside when soil has warmed and night temperatures have been above 40°.
