Care Guide:

Though its name and its reputation are as Italian as it gets, many find it interesting to note that the cultivar that we call Genovese Basil actually hails from Asia and North Africa, and then made its way north and west centuries ago. Genovese Basil today is considered by all to be the superior basil for making the tastiest pesto in the world. Plant these Genovese Basil seeds in a sunny spot and enjoy a tasty harvest of one of the world's favorite herbs.

Care Guide:

Sow seeds directly outdoors ½ inch deep and 1–2 inches apart in well-drained soil. Thin seedlings to 3–4 inches apart for ideal root growth. Harvest when roots reach 2–3 inches in diameter, or pick greens young for salads. Although biennial in nature, they are almost exclusively grown and harvested as annuals.

Columbine (*Aquilegia caerulea*) is the state flower of Colorado. Hummingbirds and beneficial insects love the nectar of this special native wildflower. Start indoors 6-8 weeks before last frost. Barely cover with soil as lights aids germination. Transplant to sunny spot in cool climate or filtered shade in hot climates. Planting depth: 1/16".

By far the most popular of the Brussels Sprouts, the Long Island Improved Brussels Sprout is an heirloom variety that's been producing delicious miniature-like cabbage heads for over 100 years. Great on your dinner table as an accompaniment to any meat or salad dish. Plant Long Island Improved Brussels Sprouts seeds in spring, summer, or fall – this is a very durable variety that can withstand cooler temperatures. The compact plant can grow up to 24 inches and will yield up to 100 sprouts over an extended period of time.

Cauliflower, Snowball



Care Guide:

Start cauliflower seeds indoors 4-6 weeks before transplanting. If planting for a fall crop, transplant 12 weeks before the first frost. Space plants 12-18 inches apart. Keep heads wrapped in outer leaves to retain white color. Cauliflower requires consistent watering and fertilization to retain flavor and prevent early small-head development.

Care Guide:

(*Allium schoenoprasum*) The slender, onion-flavored, green foliage of chives can be eaten fresh or cooked, and can even be frozen for use later. Care Guide:

Although it is really a Melon, it acts like a Cucumber! Known as one of the best slicing Cucumbers, this Armenian heirloom is rarely available for purchase so you'd best grow your own. Sow seeds outdoors in 12" diameter hills after the last frost when soil is warm. Space hills 6' apart in all directions. Can also be started indoors 2-4 weeks before the last frost for an earlier harvest. Cucumbers benefit from consistent moisture. Provide support for vines to save space. Direct seed: 1" deep.

Care Guide:

The Muncher cucumber plant variety produces a smooth nearly spineless, medium green cucumber that is crisp and delicious. This low acid favorite is now available in organic seeds. The Muncher is mosaic resistant and produces heavy yields. The taste of this cucumber is non-bitter and very tender. It can be pickled when young or eaten fresh once it reaches 8-10 inches long.

Cover lightly with 1/8" of fine soil firmly pressed down. Keep evenly moist until plants begin to grow. Covering with loose straw will help maintain moisture.

Bouquet Compact is a compact version of the beloved aromatic herb, reaching only 18" tall, making it a perfect choice for container gardens both indoors and outdoors. Features a full distinctive tangy dill flavor in its leaves and seeds, which can be dried for later use. Sow directly into well-draining soil in containers or a sunny, protected spot in the garden after last frost. Harvest leaves as needed.

Will tolerate clay soils. Plants reach 3-4' tall. Sow seeds outdoors just before last frost. Can also be started indoors and set out as small plants. Seeds can be soaked in warm water for 24 hours before planting. Prefers full sun to partial shade and well-drained rich soil. 90-120 days.

Known for its light, spicy scent, it also helps deter common garden pests, making it a favorite companion plant for vegetables and herbs.

This essential herb bears fragrant grey-green, needle like foliage and spikes of violet-blue flowers. Sow seeds indoors just beneath surface of soil. Success is greatly improved if seeds are sown in a container and placed into a plastic bag and refrigerated for 4-6 weeks. Once removed from refrigeration, place in an area that is between 55-65°. Plant out after the danger of frost has passed in late spring. Prefers well-drained, somewhat poor soil and is drought-tolerant.

Care Guide:

Buttercrunch is prized for its rich, mild taste and melt-in-your-mouth texture, making it one of the most popular lettuces for salads, wraps, and sandwiches. Space plants 6–10 inches apart. Buttercrunch thrives in full sun but benefits from light shade in hotter climates. Water consistently to encourage tender, sweet leaves and prevent bitterness.

Standing 12-36 inches tall, these beautiful flowers will create a show-stopping display in your outdoor space. As a late spring bloomer, Russel Lupine graces your garden with its majestic presence from late May to mid-June. It's important to note that plants and seeds are poisonous to livestock, so take necessary precautions if you have farm animals nearby. Blooms in summer. 150-365 days to mature depending on the source. Planting depth: 1/4".

8 to 10 weeks before last frost, start seeds indoors. Light is required for germination; barely cover seeds. When established, harden off and transplant 12" apart into soil that drains well. Plant reaches 12" tall with velvety gray-green leaves and small pink flowers. May be dried for long-term storage but is most flavorful when harvested fresh. Marjoram is technically a perennial herb but can be grown as an annual in colder climates. 70-days

Care Guide:

This heirloom bunching green onion's clusters of long, slender 12-14" white-fleshed stalks with "spring green" tips are marvels of crisp, mild flavor. Indispensable for salads, soups, pasta, and fish dishes. Excellent stir-fried with ginger and chile, or simply braised with butter.

Care Guide:

Select a sunny location and sow seed after all danger of frost has passed. Oregano is a perennial so plant in a permanent location. Plant seed 1/16" deep in rows 2 feet apart, spacing seeds 1" apart in the row. Cover with soil well pressed down. Flavor is best before plant blooms. Pick leaves as needed and use fresh or dry. Leaves may be frozen. Grows well in containers, indoors and out. Responds well to trimming.

Care Guide:

Parsley is slow but reliably germinates, so have patience. Germination can be sped up a bit by soaking seeds for 24 hours before planting. Choose a sunny spot for your parsley plants and space 3-6 inches apart. Harvest in the morning for optimal flavor. Biennial. 60-75 days.

Pumpkin, Fairytale (OUT OF STOCK)



Care Guide:

This Cucurbita moschata variety produces deeply lobed pumpkins that ripen from soft green to a warm chestnut-brown hue, prized by chefs and gardeners alike. Can be started indoors 3-4 weeks early if growing season is short, but does best sown directly in ground once soil is warmed. Once established, thin to 4-6 feet apart, leaving the strongest 2-3 plants per hill. Needs rich soil, lots of water and plenty of room for vines to spread. Scoop seeds from inside of pumpkin and use water to separate seeds from pulp. Spread seeds on wax paper so they are not touching. Flip after a few days, and continue to dry for 3-4 weeks. Store in a cool dry place for up to 4 years.

Once established, thin to 4-6 feet apart, leaving the strongest 2-3 plants per hill. Needs rich soil, lots of water and plenty of room for vines to spread.

Raddish, Cherry Belle (OUT OF STOCK)



Care Guide:

Cherry Belle radishes mature in just 22–25 days, perfect for gardeners who love quick results. They thrive in the cool temperatures of spring and fall, germinating rapidly and producing tender roots about 1 inch in diameter. For continuous harvests, sow new rows every couple of weeks and enjoy a steady supply of fresh, crunchy radishes all season long.

In 20-55 days from planting from seed, these crunchy, peppery roots will be ready to eat. Because they germinate and grow so quickly, radishes are the perfect companion plant with other slow growing crops such as carrots and parsnips. Let the radish seedlings break the soil crust for the slower-growing root crops, and you will be harvesting the radishes right when the carrots or parsnips need more room to grow.

Care Guide:

Rosemary is a woody perennial herb. It has fragrant, evergreen leaves and white, pink, purple, or blue flowers when in bloom. The plant grows as a woody shrub and is widely used in cooking, especially for seasoning meats, potatoes, and breads. Besides its culinary use, rosemary is valued for its aromatic oils and is often grown in gardens for its pleasant scent and drought tolerance. Pick leaves at any time during the growing season. Pick individual leaves or cut leafy stems as you need them.

The remove leaves and pack in jars.

Hills should be spaced 6' apart in all directions. Can also be started indoors 3 weeks before transplanting out. Plant 18-24" apart. 60-90 days to maturity.

Allow the fruits to remain on the vine until fully matured. Handle carefully and store in a moderately warm, dry place during the winter.
